RECRUITMENT REPORT 2020/2021

I joined the Board earlier this year and I was given the onerous portfolio of Recruitment. It did not take a genius to work out that we needed to increase our membership (particularly bowlers) and we needed to lift our profile around the area in general.

It was decided that we should advertise in print, on radio and any other meaningful medium, always being mindful of the costs involved. To this end we arranged the following:

An advertisement in the Forest Hill/Vermont Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) newsletter for the Feb/Mar and Apr/May editions

An advertisement in the Deakin (NHW) newsletter for the months of March, April and May.

We were unable to have an ad in the Vermont NHW newsletter due to a full book of sponsors, instead they published a full article on the history, achievements and aims of the club in their March issue.

Similarly, Mitcham had a full book of sponsors, nevertheless, they produced a very full article on the club and its activities, in their April issue. All ads underscored the theme "It's fun and it's free"

During this time we produced a radio advertisement, which is currently playing on Radio stations 3CR 855 AM and Radio Eastern FM 98.1.

We have placed flyers on the Community Noticeboards, on the Somers Trail in Mitcham and advised Brentford Square that we wish to place one on their board, when it has been rectified from its current dilapidated condition.

Contact has been made with our Councillor for Simpson Ward Cr. Prue Cutts with a view to having an ad or an article in the Council's monthly newsletter "Whitehorse News".

The Maroondah Council's publication "In Focus" only comes out twice a year and the next edition is their Winter one due about July/August.

There is a new online newspaper being produced called "Eastsider News" to offset the demise of the Leader newspapers. It is being published every 2 months. It is our intention to have news about the HBC in every edition. The next issue comes out in April and we should have two (2) articles included one about the club and the second one about the meritorious efforts of our successful pennant teams.

However, due to their deadlines, we were not able to supply details of their efforts after their section wins.

We have made overtures into other avenues such as U3A, our club becoming a HUB club (more later), ads on railway stations, bus shelters and the like

Our costs to date have been \$100 for radio production and \$125 for NHW advertising

It is difficult to gauge the effectiveness of our efforts to date. Suffice to say that a lot more people are aware of our existence, however that does not necessarily materialise into membership numbers straight away. It will be a continuing slog, but I, we, us can see that there is light at the end of the tunnel, particularly with the success of our pennant teams, and finally, of course, there is no better advertising than word of mouth.
